

3,000 OFF-LIST WORDS Straight out of the vault



Congratulations! You're opening the vault...

Written for spellers trying to anticipate the abstruse words that might come up at the National Bee or a regional bee, the *Blitz List* is our collection of words that have not been used before. All words in this collection have not been seen in any regional bee, National Bee, the Consolidated Word List, *New Nat's Notes*,



Verbomania, or annual study booklets from Words of the Champions through Paideia and into Spell It. At least, they haven't appeared in any of these up through the 2011 bees! This volume contains 3,000 of these words.

Having worked with spellers in the national arena for 30 years, we've collected words from a large number of sources, including our Weird Word of the Week, various specialized lists swapped and traded with spellers over the years, and words we've ferreted out of *Webster's Third* that are esoteric. Finally, we've started editing these words, adding phonetic pronunciations and definitions and putting them in a format for publication. (*BlitzMentor* software and *BlitzFlips* are scheduled to become available by mid-summer for computerized study of these words.)

In 2011, 35% of the words at the National Bee were of this ilk. Not counting the 25-word written round, the 2011 Champion Sukanya Roy spelled a total of 17 words that were not on a provided list, and 7 had never been used in a bee prior to 2011 National Bee. For runner-up Laura Newcombe, 6 of her 16 words had never been used before 2011.

This collection is ideal for those students who have conquered *Verbomania* and *New Nat's Notes* and have probably spent quality time with the *Spelling Rules Book* and learned an enormous amount about Latin and Greek etymology. This is the obvious next step in expanding your spelling foundation. Still, around 60+% of all Regional and National Bee words are from *Verbomania*+ and *New Nat's*, but recent years have shown that 30+% are from nowhere, and these are the types of words we're including in our *Blitz List* collections.

Our pronunciations follow those in *Webster's Third New International*, unabridged, and its addenda. Providing up to 4 possibilities, we have omitted many strictly regional dialects. Also included are the part(s) of speech and short definitions. The following abbreviations are used: E=English, Fr=French, Du=Dutch, Ep=Eponym, Ger=German, Gk=Greek, Imit=imitative, It=Italian, J=Japanese, L=Latin, Unk=unknown origin, etc. Simple abbreviations are used to compact this data, such as fr=from, prob=probably, perh=perhaps, etc. These should all become self-evident. Learn the following vowel translations, which should give little trouble. The *ii* for the long *i* sound can be confusing, and the vowel sound in *boy*, which is a combination of *aw* and *i* may be difficult. *Boy* would be shown as <BAWI>.

We've edited and reedited, but we know that glitches can slip past us. If you find any errors, please let us know so that we can correct it and let others know who have this volume. We added homonyms along the way, but we didn't begin to catch all the possible homonyms.
