Set 1 - North America

- Booker T. Washington was the principal of a university which originally specialized in training African American teachers. The university shares its name with the city in which it was founded. Is it Huntsville or Tuskegee?
- Which part of the Appalachian Mountain system lies on the Allegheny Plateau in southeast New York, is bordered to the north by the Mohawk River Valley, and is bordered to the east by the Hudson River Valley, the Boston or the Catskills?
- 3. The mining of silver, gold, copper, and opals is important in this mountainous Mexican state whose varied elevations enable the production of a wide range of crops, including corn, coffee, and fruits. Is this state, whose capital and largest city is Pachuca, Hidalgo or Tabasco?
- 4. Which city hosts a 500-mile car race held annually in late May and serves as an industrial center for its state?
- 5. Joggins Fossil Cliffs have been designated a World Heritage Site.   Canadian River and is the site of dolomite
  outcroppings used since the days of the Clovis
  people for making projectile points, North
  Dakota or Texas?
- 8. This inland port is linked to the Gulf of Mexico by the Ship Channel and to Galveston by the Intracoastal Waterway, and once served as the capital of Texas. Today this city is home to the Astros baseball team and Rice University. Is this city Houston or Texas City?
- 9. Lichen-covered, black-stained walls give this narrow Colorado canyon east of the city of Montrose its name. The focal point of an area designated a national park in 1999, which river carved this black canyon, the Arkansas or the Gunnison?
- 10. Mesa Verde National Park contains cliff dwellings from the late 12<sup>th</sup> century that were built by the Anasazi. Cliff Palace is thought to be the largest cliff dwelling in North America. Is this park located in Colorado or New Mexico?
- 11. Fort Erie, Canada lies opposite which large New York, U.S. city—Buffalo or Syracuse?
- 12. Name the mountains located in the state with the mile-high capital which are the source for the headstream of the Rio Grande River and are composed of mainly volcanic rock.

- These mountains in eastern Taiwan are composed of three ranges and contain Mount Yü (Hsin-kao), the highest peak in Taiwan. Name this range.
- 6. The Valdes Peninsula is an important nature reserve that was designated a World Heritage Site in 1999 because of its marine mammals, including baleen whales. This peninsula extends into the Atlantic from what country?
