n, v / items in a receptacle; satisfies

n / people who go to take up residence in a frontier area

adj, n / naturally inclined to seek and enjoy the companionship of others

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{n}}$  / spar that attaches to and extends the bowsprit

fermata <fehr.MAHT.uh>

n / indication for a note of music to be prolonged;performance of such

rhenium <REE.nee.uhm>

n / metallic element similar to manganese chemically
