Tests may be copied for use on one campus. The time allotted for taking the entire test is 90 minutes. All sections should be completed within this time frame.

All questions should be answered with the best possible choice. The section on General Knowledge contains questions derived from Internet sources and various background data. The Primary Reading section covers the book. The section on Supporting Materials contains questions on the assigned countries and regions. The fourth section asks for an essay and is graded with the rubric provided as part of the Answer Key.

SCORING: The objective portion of all tests will be scored. A judge or judges will then evaluate the essays of the eight contestants with the highest scores in the objective portion of the test; and if a tie occurs for the eighth slot, essays of all contestants tied for eighth will also be judged.

Each essay will be read and assigned a score based on a 0 to 20 scale, with 20 being the highest score possible. The judges will confer to determine the point value of each essay by compromise, not via a running point total or average. The score will be added to the point total from the objective portion of the test, resulting in an overall score. If at this point a tie exists, then those essays involved in the tie will be judged one against the other to break the tie.
